"ENGINE COMPANY OPERATIONS"

The Engine Officer and the Nozzleman, From the Firehouse to Fire Floor

Every firefighting position is critical to the success of the entire operation. The 1st. due Engine Officer and the Nozzleman stand out, above all others, as positions that truly can make or break the operation.

The officer's decisions and initial actions along with the nozzleman's ability to complete his assigned tasks will have far reaching effects on any subsequent decisions and further actions.

This course will take you, as an officer, from the firehouse to the fire floor.

It will cover actions prior to emergencies such as trust issues, training, district surveys, and position assignments.

It also takes an in depth look at all the actions the officer should take upon arriving at a fire scene including size-up, initial radio reports, line placement and the size of it, communications and actual hose line supervision.

The Nozzleman's position is without question the single best position in the Fire Service, but with that position comes enormous responsibility. The course will cover this position from start to finish, which includes hose line estimates, stretching lines, fire attack preparations and the advancing of lines through different room layouts.

Finally this course will take you through a number of different hose line emergencies and the actions that should be taken if one of these events occur, the time to learn what to do during an emergency is before it happens.

Tim Klett is a 35-year veteran of the fire service. He was a volunteer firefighter with the Newington (Connecticut) Fire Department for five years before becoming a paid firefighter with the City of New Britain (Connecticut) Fire Department, where he served for four years until his appointment to the New York City Fire Department in 1990. Klett worked in Engine Company 69 in Harlem for 12 years and is currently assigned to Engine Company 88, 7th Division, in the Bronx. He has served as a lead instructor for the FDIC live fire HOT program and lectures frequently on a variety of topics, including engine company operations. Klett is the author of "Stretching and Operating the First Line" published in Fire Notes by the Fire Department Training Network, where he also serves as lead engine instructor. He has also written several articles for Fire Engineering, Firehouse.com, Firescue Interactive, and SIZE UP.
